- » The NBK is a bibliographic database, which will underpin several Jisc Library Hub service components
- » These include:
 - › Discover: <https://libraryhub.jisc.ac.uk/discover> (pilot launched Feb 2019, full service available July 2019)
 - › Compare (collection management, available July 2019)
 - › Cataloguing: <https://cataloguing.libraryhub.jisc.ac.uk> (authentication required; pilot launched Feb 2019, full service available July 2019)

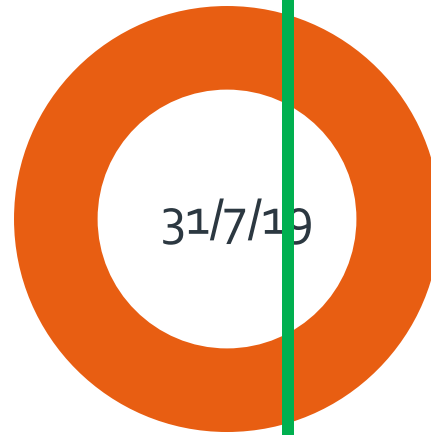

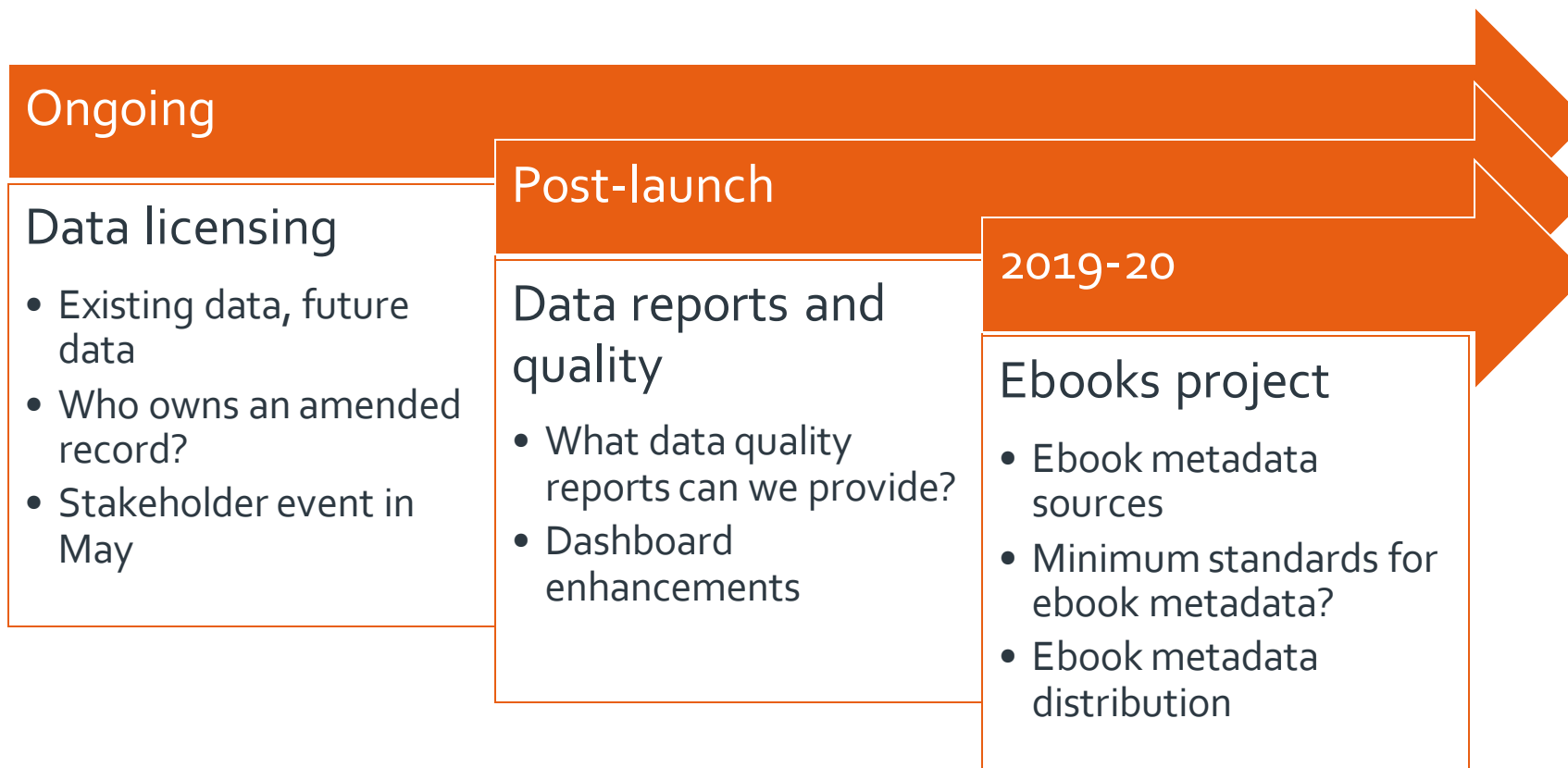

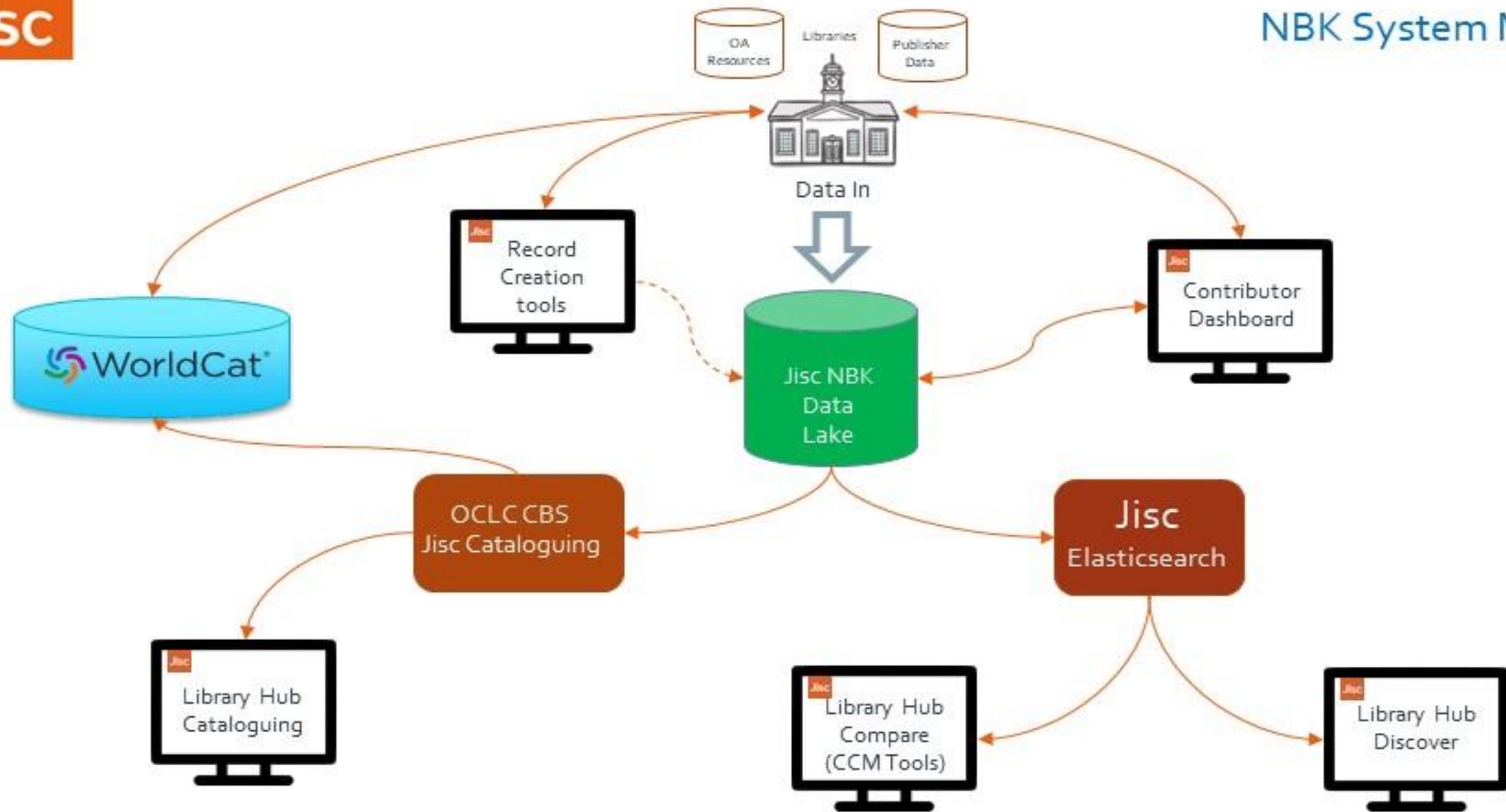

- » Flexibility & Clarity
 - › Support differing use cases
 - › Manage differing data sources & data flows
 - › Manage data licensing restrictions
 - › Support Jisc cross-service developments
- » Shared Cataloguing, Data Synchronisation with third parties:
 - › focus on data quality
- » Resource Discovery and Collection Management:
 - › focus on comprehensiveness
- » Support developments in data upgrade and cross-service activity

- » <https://contribute.copac.jisc.ac.uk/dashboard/>
 - › Requires login

- » Currently
 - › Contributor Questionnaires: Shared record of system and library information
 - › Library Information: review data supply
 - › Library Information: review library configuration

- » Future
 - › Data analysis tools
 - › Data upgrade facilities

» Data varies ...

» Minimum record

- › We have to be able to process the records
- › We need a title
- › We require physical/electronic holdings for *some* libraries

» Shared cataloguing

- › Having to select from multiple possible duplicate records
- › Shared record errors may affect discoverability or clarity/accuracy in local catalogues

» Resource discovery:

- › Resources may be hard to find
- › May be hard to locate the correct version of a document among multiple variant records
- › Potential for carrying out research on the database may be affected by duplicate data.

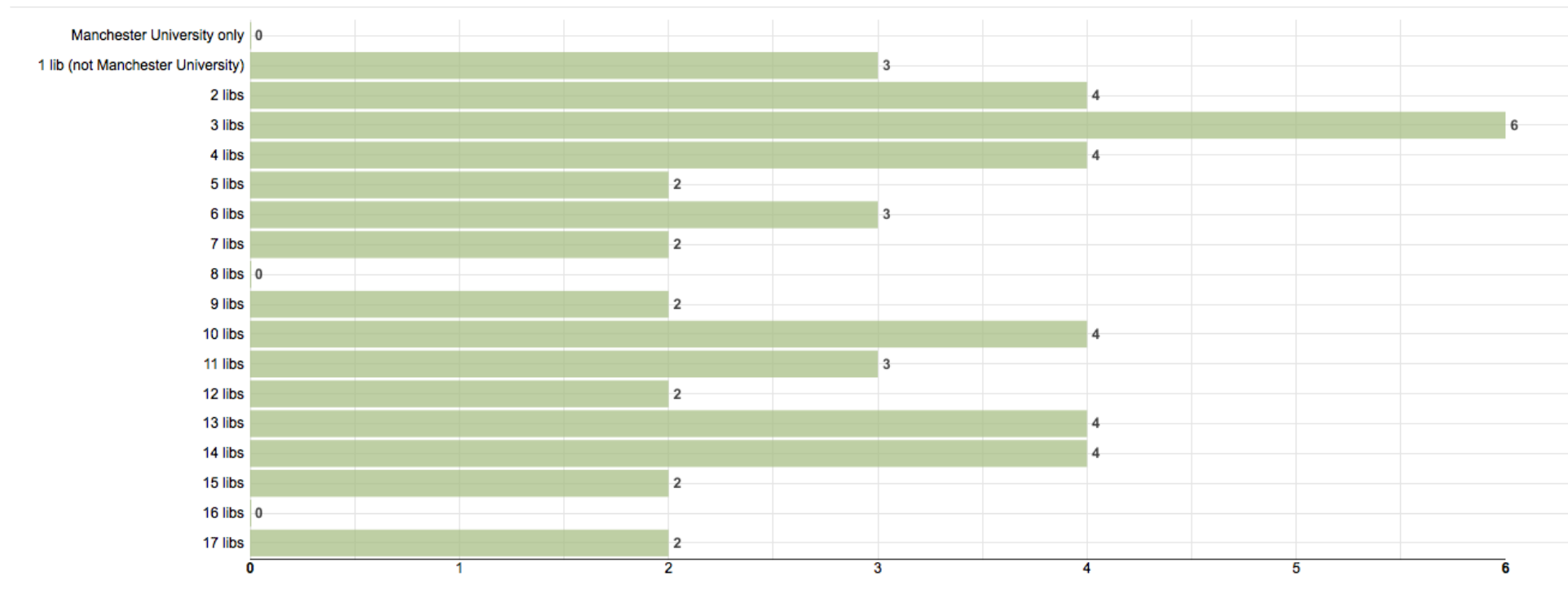

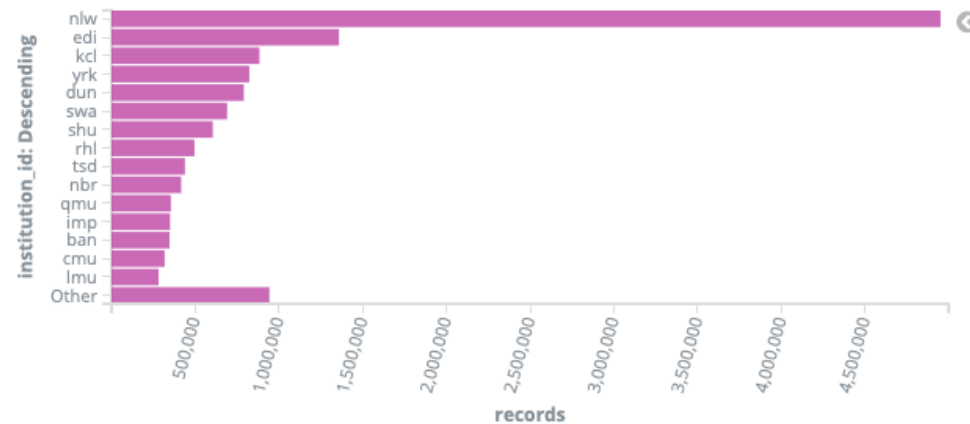

Item: Institution record counts



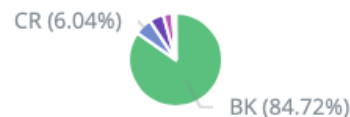

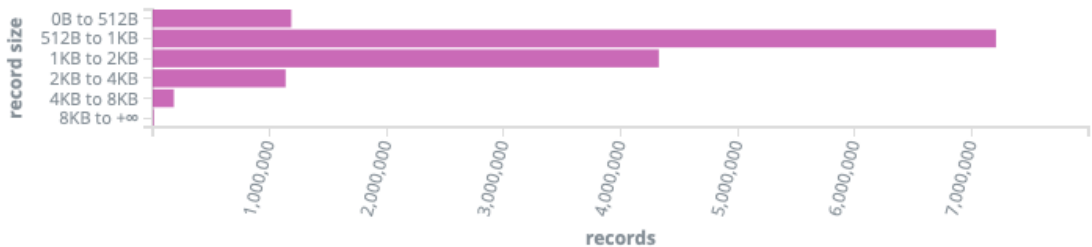

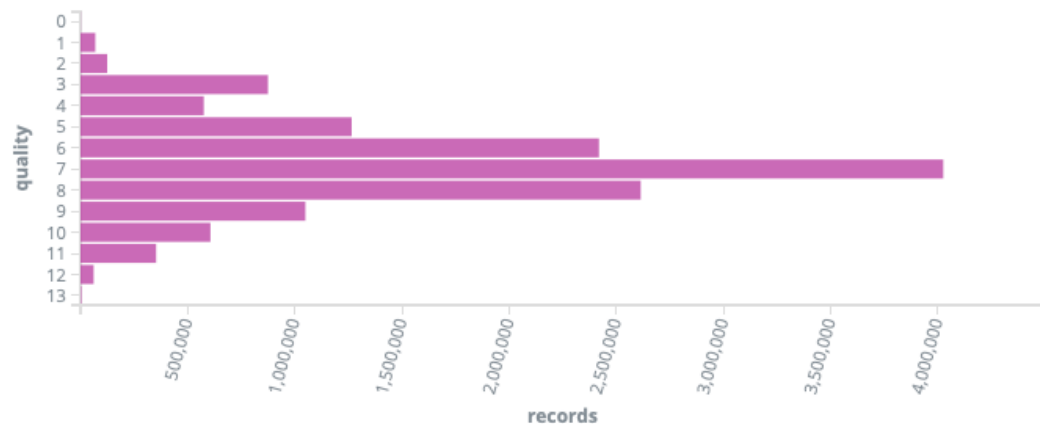

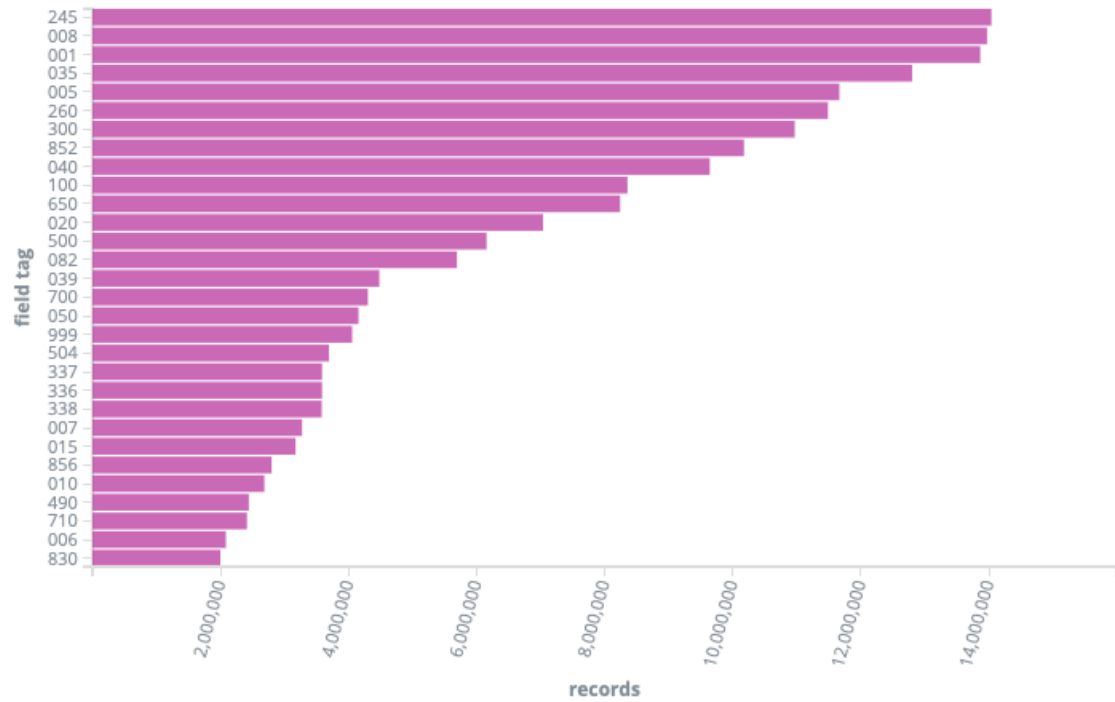

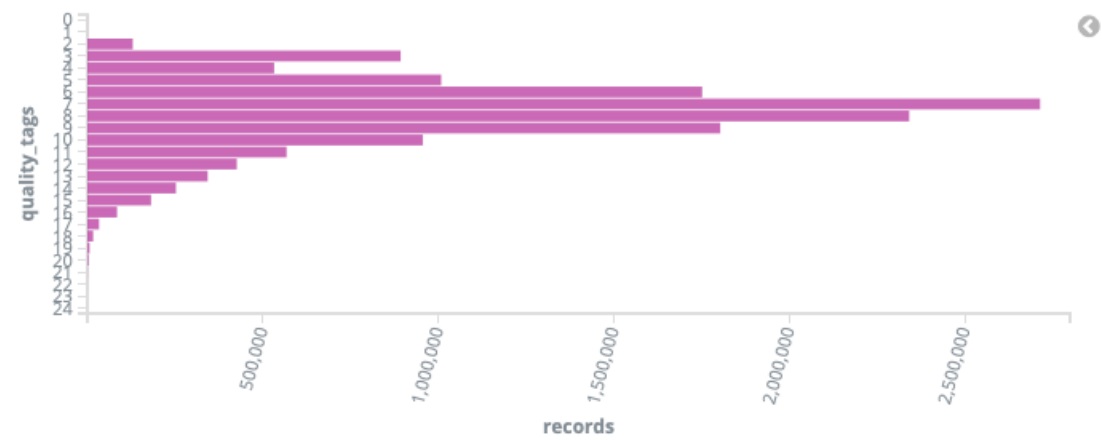

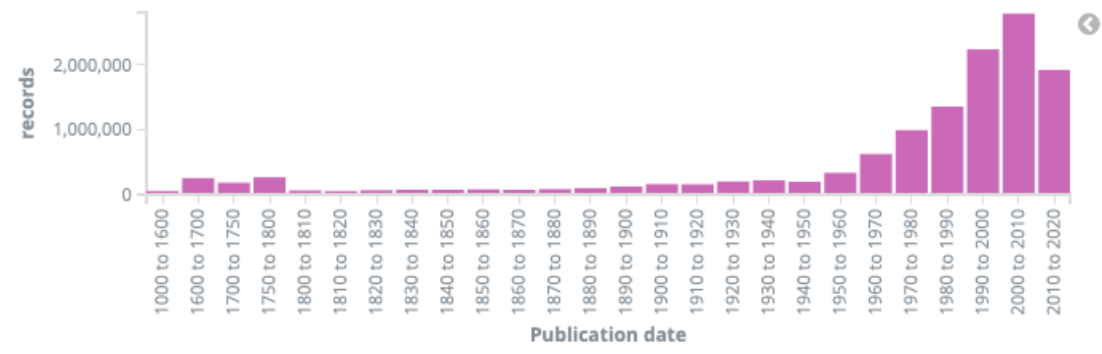

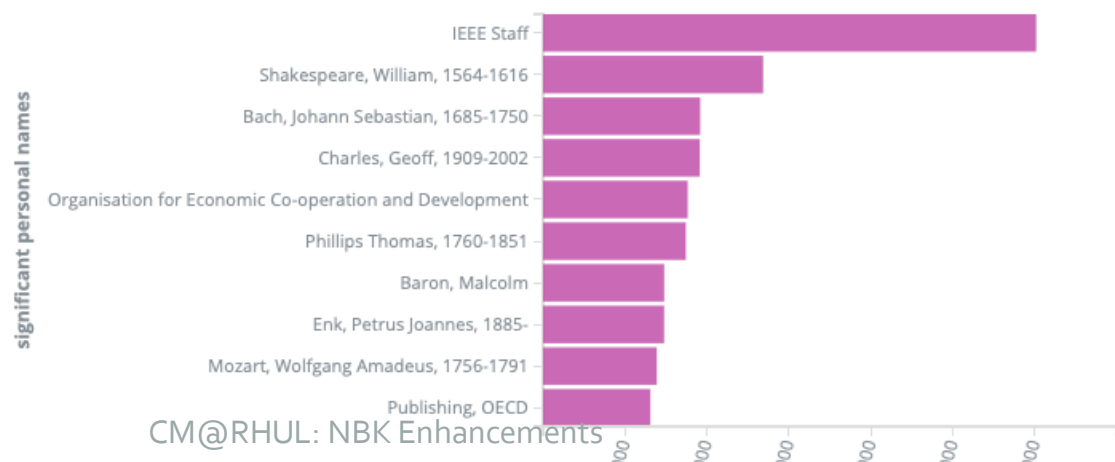

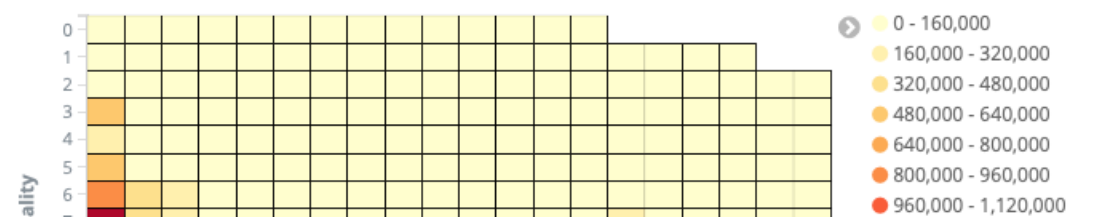

- » Supplying better records/record content – multiple options
 - › Matches
 - › Potential matches
- » Interface – build metrics into NBK Contributor Dashboard
- » Risks – but potential benefits
- » Differing requirements

- » Metadata summit: steps in the right direction?

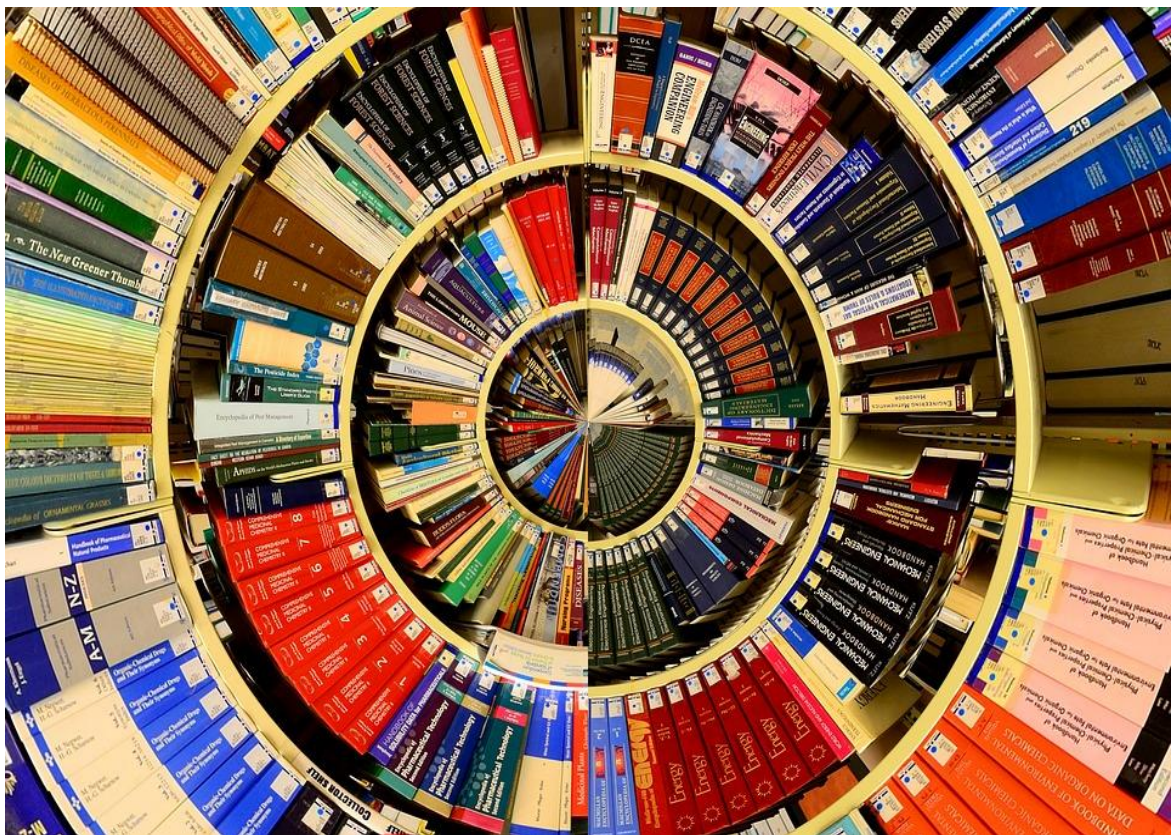
